# 1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY - TE KAUPAPA ME TE WHAKARĀPOPOTOTANGA

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to obtain a decision from the Committee in regard to the following temporary road closures as requested below. These requests arise from the need to inform and gain Hastings District Council ("the Council") approval in order to comply with the legal process to temporarily close the roads listed below:
  - The Hawke's Bay Car Club (HBCC) Mokamoka Road from RP No.1000 to RP No. 9000. The road closure will be between 9:00am and 5:00pm, on Sunday, 1 September 2019. The purpose of this road closure is to hold a motorsport event.
  - Creative Hastings Blossom Parade on Saturday, 14 September 2019.
     The purpose of this road closure is to hold the Annual Blossom Parade.
     The times and roads involved are set out in detail in the recommendations.
- 1.2 This report contributes to the purpose of local government by primarily promoting the cultural and social wellbeing and specifically to the Council's strategic objectives by promoting the appealing visitor destination wellbeing of communities in the present and for the future.
- 1.3 Given that there are no submissions in opposition to the closures and that subject to the recommended conditions the activity can proceed and be undertaken in a safe and controlled environment, the risks associated with this closures can then be minimised and safely managed to Council's satisfaction.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS - NGĀ TŪTOHUNGA**

- A) That the Committee receives the report titled Temporary Road Closures Mokamoka Road 1 September 2019, Annual Blossom Parade 14 September 2019
- B) That the Committee <u>approve</u> the following temporary road closures as no submissions have been received in respect of these applications:
  - 1. The Hawke's Bay Car Club (HBCC) Mokamoka Road from RP No.1000 to RP No. 9000. The road closure will be between 9:00am and 5:00pm, Sunday, 1 September 2019.
  - 2. Creative Hastings <u>Annual Blossom Parade</u> to be held on Saturday, 14 September 2019.

C) The Committee approve the above temporary road closures subject to the following conditions to be complied with to the satisfaction of the Group Manager: Asset Management:

- i. These events are conducted in accordance with the New Zealand Transport Agency Code of Practice Temporary Traffic Management (CoPTTM).
- ii. The Traffic Management Plans including provision for appropriate signage are approved by the Traffic Management Coordinator acting under delegated authority.
- iii. The Traffic Management Plans must be complied with including any specific conditions.
- iv. Copies of the relevant liability insurance policies are received.
- v. That the cost of all advertising is met by the event organisers.
- vi. Emergency Services are contacted regarding the holding of these events with details of the dates, locations and time frames.
- vii. As per the Traffic Management Plan provisions all emergency services will be accommodated and access provided through the sites as required.
- viii. The applicant is responsible under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 for all health and safety risks associated with this activity and must take reasonably practicable steps to ensure the safety of all persons during these temporary road closures.
- ix. The applicant has in place at all times, appropriate Health and Safety measures (to prevent harm to any persons), including (but not limited to) any measures provided for in the submitted Health and Safety Plans including any conditions attached.
- x. These Hawke's Bay Car Club events shall be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Motorsport New Zealand Motor Sport Manual, National Sporting Code and Appendices.

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND - TE HOROPAKI

- 2.1 This report covers the applications by the HBCC and Creative Hastings to temporarily close roads so that a sporting event (HBCC) and a cultural event (Creative Hastings) can be held. The preferred option is to allow the closure of the above roads so that the listed events can be undertaken.
- 2.2 The temporary road closures will be managed in accordance with the New Zealand Transport Agency Code of Practice Temporary Traffic Management (CoPTTM).
- 2.3 Detailed Traffic Management Plans are to be submitted to the Hastings District Council and the plans will be approved for implementation, subject to the temporary road closure applications being approved.
- 2.4 The temporary road closure checklist (**Attachment 1**) details the necessary items that the organisers need to submit as part of their application for the above proposed road closures.
- 2.5 GIS maps showing the area of the temporary road closures are also attached as part of **Attachment 1:** (HBCC) Mokamoka Road; (Creative Hastings) Russell Street South, Lyndon Road East, Warren Street South, Heretaunga Street West, Heretaunga Street East, Eastbourne Street West, Queen Street West, Nelson Street South, Market Street South, Karamu Road North and Eastbourne Street East.
- 2.6 At the time of writing this report there were no planned road works that will affect or impact the above temporary road closures. Additionally, the section of Eastbourne Street between Russell Street and Warren Street will be in a trafficable condition for the Blossom Parade.

#### 3.0 DISCUSSION - TE MATAPAKITANGA

- 3.1 The above events are being undertaken by the following organisations:
  - The HBCC Mokamoka Road. This will be the first temporary closure of the above road during the 2019 calendar year. The above road has been chosen specifically for its suitability for holding motorsport events.
    - The average daily traffic count for Mokamoka Road is: 55 vehicles per day.
  - Creative Hastings Annual Blossom Parade being held on the above roads. All roads are being closed for the first time this calendar year except Russell Street South which is being closed for the second time this calendar year.
    - The average daily traffic count for the roads forming part of the Blossom Parade Route:

#### 4.0 OPTIONS - NGĀ KŌWHIRINGA

Option One - Recommended Option - *Te Kōwhiringa Tuatahi – Te Kōwhiringa Tūtohunga* 

- 4.1 **Option A** is the preferred option. It recommends the Committee approve the temporary road closures detailed above, subject to conditions that will ensure public safety is maintained.
- 4.2 Temporary road closure options listed below:
  - Option A: Approve the temporary road closures detailed above.

Advantages: All events can proceed and contribute to the safe use of roads within the district for these proposed events.

Disadvantages: Traffic will be impeded for a short period of time.

• Option B: Do not approve the temporary road closures detailed above.

Advantages: Traffic will not be impeded.

Disadvantages: All proposed events will need to be cancelled.

 Option C: Approve only one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve or thirteen of the temporary road closures detailed above.

Advantages: Only traffic on specific roads will be impeded.

Disadvantages: Depending on which roads are temporarily closed this may result in the cancellation of some or all the proposed events.

# SUMMARY OF CONSIDERATIONS - HE WHAKARĀPOPOTO WHAIWHAKAARO

# Fit with purpose of Local Government - E noho hāngai pū ai ki te Rangatōpū-ā-rohe

The Council is required to give effect to the purpose of local government as set out in section 10 of the Local Government Act 2002. That purpose is to enable democratic local decision-making and action by (and on behalf of) communities, and to promote the social, economic, environmental, and cultural well-being of communities in the present and for the future.

The above temporary road closures will be undertaken in accordance with The Local Government Act 1974 Schedule 10, section 11 and section 11(e) which states:

- "11. The council may, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit (including the imposition of a reasonable bond), and after consultation with the Police and the Ministry of Transport, close any road or part of a road to all traffic or any specified type of traffic (including pedestrian traffic)."
- "(e) For a period or periods not exceeding in the aggregate 31 days in any year for any exhibition, fair, show, market, concert, film-making, race or other sporting event, or public function:

Provided that no road may be closed for any purpose specified in paragraph (e) of this clause if that closure would, in the opinion of the council, be likely to impede traffic unreasonably."

This report contributes to the purpose of local government by primarily promoting the cultural and social wellbeing of the community.

## Consultation – internal and/or external - Whakawhiti Whakaaro-ā-roto, ā-waho

The organisers of the above events have been in contact with affected parties/residents. They advise that no issues have been raised regarding the above proposed temporary road closures.

The temporary road closure of **Mokamoka Road** has been posted on the Council website and formal public notification was published in the Hawke's Bay today newspaper on Saturday, 13 July 2019.

The closing date for submissions for **Mokamoka Road** was 4:00pm, Monday, 29 July 2019. No submissions were received.

If the road closures are approved, final formal public notification will be published in the Hawke's Bay Today newspaper on Saturday, 31 August 2019.

The temporary road closures for the **Blossom Parade** has been posted on the Council website and formal public notification was published in the Hawke's Bay today newspaper on Saturday, 6 July 2019.

The closing date for submissions for **the Blossom Parade** was 4:00pm, Monday, 22 July 2019. No submissions were received.

If the road closures are approved, final formal public notification will be published in the Hawke's Bay Today newspaper on Friday, 13 September 2019.

As per the requirements of schedule 10, section 11 of the Local Government Act, Emergency Services including NZ Police, St John Ambulance, Ministry of Transport (MoT), New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) and the Fire Service have been informed and will be allowed emergency access at all times during the temporary road closures. Council has not received any submissions from emergency services, MoT or NZTA.

### Risks: Legal/ Health and Safety - Ngā Tūraru: Ngā Ture / Hauora me te

As per the requirements of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015, the applicant is required to include a Health and Safety Plan with their temporary road closure application. Additionally, conditions drawing the applicants' attention to their

respective obligations have been provided in the recommendations.


#### Rural Community Board - Ngā Poari-ā-hapori
