Mr Neville advised of a correction to the agenda report. The proposed investment by HB Regional Investment Company (HBRIC) was \$4m – not \$5m as noted in the report.

- C) That Council resolve pursuant to Clause 5.3.1(a)(i) of Chapter 5 (Parking and Traffic) of the Hastings District Council Consolidated Bylaw 2016, that the existing two P60 parking spaces located 36 metres from the intersecting point of Hastings Street South and extending 15 metres west on the northern side of Eastbourne Street East be revoked and becomes a P5 Loading Zone.
- D) That Council resolve pursuant to Clause 5.3.1(a)(i) of Chapter 5 (Parking and Traffic) of the Hastings District Council Consolidated Bylaw 2016, that the existing three P60 parking spaces located 22 metres from the intersecting point of Hastings Street South and extending 36 metres west on the southern side of Eastbourne Street East be revoked and become P15 parking spaces.
- E) That Council resolve pursuant to Clause 5.3.1(a)(i) of Chapter 5 (Parking and Traffic) of the Hastings District Council Consolidated Bylaw 2016, that the existing parking spaces located 3 metres south from the intersecting point of Tawa Street and extending 26 metres south on the southern side of Frederick Street West become P5 parking spaces between 8am – 9am and 2-45pm – 3-30pm week days only.
- F) That Council resolve pursuant to Clause 5.3.1(a)(i) of Chapter 5 (Parking and Traffic) of the Hastings District Council Consolidated Bylaw 2016, that the existing five P60 parking spaces located 21 metres south from the intersecting point of Heretaunga Street East and extending 32 metres south on the eastern side of Karamū Road South become a Clearway Area from 11pm until 6am 7 days a week.
- G) That Council resolve pursuant to Clause 5.3.1(a)(i) of Chapter 5 (Parking and Traffic) of the Hastings District Council Consolidated Bylaw 2016, that the existing P15 Parking located 29 metres south from the intersecting point of Heretaunga Street East and extending 28 south on the western side of Russell Street South be revoked.
- H) That Council resolve pursuant to Clause 5.3.1(a)(i) of Chapter 5 (Parking and Traffic) of the Hastings District Council Consolidated Bylaw 2016, that the parking spaces located 29 metres south from the intersecting point of Heretaunga Street East and extending 28 south on the western side of Russell Street South become P60 parking.
- That Council resolve pursuant to Clause 5.3.1(a)(i) of Chapter 5 (Parking and Traffic) of the Hastings District Council Consolidated Bylaw 2016, that the existing 4 P120 parking spaces located 52 metres north from the intersecting point of Heretaunga Street East and extending 22 metres north on the eastern side of Warren Street North be revoked.
