During the year ended 28 February 2021 the administrator was paid \$11,760.00 over a period of 42 weeks and the Society incurred an overall deficit (after depreciation) of \$22,000.00. During the same period the administrator worked, on average, an extra 15 hours a week without pay in order to fulfil all of her duties. Clearly this situation is unsustainable and urgency is paramount to future proof the viability of Keirunga. Future Situation Keirunga is partly owned by the Hastings District Council and while it is a fabulous facility, many people are unaware of its existence. The Keirunga Gardens Arts & Crafts Society Incorporated has been in existence since 1964 and deserves to be recognized as a top class venue by the wider Hawkes Bay community. Plan The new board is determined and has a plan in place to expand Keirunga's profile, increase its membership and bring it back into profitability. To achieve this we need an administrator on site at least three hours a day to deal with members' concerns and to greet potential new members. She will also be able to be involved in the day to day aspects of the organisation. Her list of tasks/duties is included under the Planned Activities document.	\$20,000.00

Part of our Day Programme is around the importance of nutrition and a healthy hot meal. This is a huge relief to the loved ones of our clients as some of our clients live alone and family are reassured that they are getting a decent meal while attending. Along with this comes our obligation to provide a safe environment and this includes cleaning if the dishes after their meals and tea times. These need to be run through a dishwasher with hot enough temperatures to sterilise dishes. The dishwashers we currently have a very old and 1 has actually broken down, so the 2 Hastings houses are having to share 1 dishwasher to see us through.	\$4,402.20
