- Assisting Council by reviewing and considering submissions and deciding applications for temporary closure of roads.
- Recommending to Council the appointment of trustees to Te Mata Park Trust Board.
- Recommending to Council the appointment of directors to Hastings District Holdings Limited.
- Recommending to Council the appointment of List Members to the District Licencing Committee.
- Assisting Council by reviewing, considering nominations and recommending recipients of Civic Awards.
- Assisting Council by remaining cognisant of activities in the Community that deliver improved wellbeing and safety outcomes and advising Council how it can appropriately enable these activities.
- Providing guidance and oversight to Council Officers in the delivery of Council safety and security investments & initiatives to improve community wellbeing and sense of feeling safe and welcome.
- Providing guidance and oversight to Council Officers in the delivery of major Council civic development capital projects (projects as assigned to the Subcommittee).
- Providing comprehensive six monthly (and as required) Council civic development capital project progress reports to the Performance and Monitoring Committee.
- Providing guidance and oversight to Council Officers in the delivery of major Council and Council enabled Events.

Providing guidance and oversight to Council Officers in the active promotion of Hastings as a Visitor Destination.

Quorum

- 8) Recommend to Council the appointment of List Members to the Hastings District Licensing Committee in accordance with the policy on the appointment of members for the District Licensing Committee, and the provisions of Sections 192 – 194 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

1.0 Executive Summary – *Te Kaupapa Me Te Whakarāpopototanga*

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to obtain a decision from the Civic Development Subcommittee regarding the 2024 round of grant allocations from the Single-year Community Grant Scheme.
- 1.2 There are 45 eligible applications for the Subcommittee to assess with a total request of \$629,486.61.
- 1.3 There is a \$126,000 Single-year Community Grant funding allocation identified in the draft Council 2024-2034 Long Term Plan. Any Subcommittee resolutions regarding the allocation of funding will be subject to the adoption of the 2024 – 2034 Long Term Plan (which is anticipated in June 2024).
- 1.4 This report concludes by recommending that the funds be allocated to those applicants assessed by the Subcommittee as having the highest merit, being of wide appeal, being accessible and delivering the needs of the community.

2.0 Recommendations - *Ngā Tūtohunga*

- A) That the Civic Development Subcommittee receive the report titled Single-year Community Grants 2024-2025, dated 19 June 2024.
- B) That the Subcommittee reviews the applications to the 2024 Single-year Community Grants funding round; and
- C) That the Subcommittee (subject to the Council adoption of the 2024- 2034 Long Term Plan which accounts for these funding allocations) allocates the 2024 budget allocation of \$126,000.00 to those applications which it considers will best assist Council to achieve its desired community outcomes.

- D) That the Subcommittee (subject to the Council adoption of the 2024- 2034 Long Term Plan which sets the future funding allocations) agrees to reduce the funding cap from \$20,000 to \$15,000 for future applications to the Single Year Community Grants scheme from 2025.

3.0 Background – *Te Horopaki*

- 3.1 The annual Single-year Community Grants round invites local community groups and organisations to apply to Council for an opportunity to work together to meet the current and future needs of our community.
- 3.2 Applications are invited from organisations delivering projects or services that address the following needs:
- Uplifting our community’s wellbeing by providing access to help and advice.
 - Fostering a sense of pride within our district and across our diverse communities.
 - Promoting happy, healthy and active communities.
- 3.3 Successful organisations are provided with a funding agreement and if required, assigned a Council officer (relationship manager) to work with them to achieve agreed outcomes for the grant awarded.
- 3.4 Grants are for one year only and available from 1 July 2024.
- 3.5 Applications opened on 25 March 2024 and closed on 26 April 2024.
- 3.6 There were originally 61 applications for this year’s annual contestable funding round. 16 applications submitted to the Single-year Community Grants Scheme met the criteria for the Hastings Mayoral Relief Fund and have been funded from that fund, leaving the Civic Development Subcommittee with 45 applications to assess.
- 3.7 Each application has been reviewed by relevant Council officers prior to this meeting to assist the Subcommittee in making allocations. All applications are eligible and fit within the scope of the grant.
- 3.8 The Subcommittee members have been supplied with the 45 confidential applications for review, a summary of applications is set out in the table under Paragraph 4.4.
- 3.9 As with previous years, all applicants have been given the opportunity to present to the Subcommittee. 33 applicants will present to the Subcommittee on 19 June 2024. The Subcommittee will then undertake its deliberations and finalise allocations.

- 3.10 The total of request from the 45 Single-year Community Grants is \$629,486.61. The Single-year Community Grants budget for 2024/2025 is \$126,000.00. This means that the budget allocation is oversubscribed by \$503,486.61.
- 3.11 The Single-year Community Grants budget is part of the overall Community Contestable Grants budget. This year’s Community Contestable Grants budget is ten percent lower than previous years, as per the Draft Long Term Plan 2024 – 2034.
- 3.12 The full applications are confidential and are contained in a confidential attachment document (**Attachment 1**).

3.14 The Subcommittee has also allocated 25 Multi-year Community Partnership Grants out of the Community Contestable Grants budget, these three-year funding agreements also start in July 2024 and end in June 2027. For reference these are below:

4.0 Discussion – Te Matapakitanga

- 4.1 The objective of the Single-year Community Grants is for the development and delivery of community services or projects.
- 4.2 Evidence of planning and budgets are required as part of the applications. Organisations are able to apply for up to \$20,000 per year, staff are recommending that this be reduced for \$15,000 for future funding years.
- 4.3 To be eligible for funding, groups need to show how their project fits within one or more of the priorities below:
- Uplifting our community's wellbeing by providing access to help and advice.
 - Fostering a sense of pride within our district and across our diverse communities.
 - Promoting happy, healthy and active communities.
- 4.4 45 applications have been received. The Subcommittee members have been supplied with the full applications via the Smarty Grants online platform, a summary of the applications is set out below. A speaking list is attached as **Attachment 2**:
