# **Draft 2024/25 Financial Result**



## 2024/25 Financial Summary

#### Improved Liquidity

- Total Net Borrowings are \$443m against a budget of \$482m
- Rates arrears reduced to <2.5% of Rates, no of accounts in arrears reduced by 36%

#### Rates result

- \$4.3m to "balance the budget" against the planned borrowing of \$14m.
- 82% of expenditure is on areas considered as Core services or a statutory obligation of Council.


Capital expenditure \$231m against a budget of \$289m (includes cyclone recovery of \$128m). 70% of the \$231M was externally sourced

#### Results are un-audited-

- EY progressing Annual Audit
- Audit covers Council processes, transactions and balances
- Full results presented on October 9 when the Annual report will be adopted



# Revenue






# **Key Revenue Variances Council**

# **Expenditure**







- Personnel Costs \$3.2m



Capital programme overview

## **Non BAU Capital** Cyclone remains a critical feature

#### Significant ongoing work with our funding partners ~ \$118m on Transport

- New Zealand Transport Agency
- Higher subsidy rate (FAR from 73% to 83%) approved till 30 June 2029
- Progressing recovery works and further funding support approvals being progressed
- Crown Funding agreement (NIFF management oversight)
- \$226m funding agreement with Crown
- Progressing work programme within initial estimates and contingency
- Havelock Streams 2C improvement works properties now re-classified to Category 1, and phased work programme underway

#### Lots of external oversight required by external funders

 Both entities performing audits and have multi- step approvals of Council proposals, procurement, invoicing and claims

#### Incoming Council will have opportunity to review cyclone financial strategy

- Current indications are that overall programme is likely to require less local share (rates) than initial estimated
- Timing of programme will need review if desire is to leverage higher FAR
- Level of service conversations on some sites if NZTA are unwilling to co-fund some

## **BAU Capital**

## **Asset Renewals, Compliance, and Growth**

#### Transport funding – renewal and improvements ~ \$16m

- NZTA Funding support not confirmed until 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter
- · Reduced funding support across a number of areas
- Lower than optimum renewal support increasing service failure risk
- Council funding approach (Dec 24) reduced expenditure to plan, contributing to lower borrowings

#### Growth capital ~ \$23m

- Considerable investment supporting growth areas
- Enabling infrastructure to unlock future growth and urban intensification

#### Three Waters ~ \$30m

- Renewals and upgrades for compliance continued
- Re-phased work to reduce borrowing demand, and further smooth work programme
- Wider Havelock North streams strategy underway
- wider service level/investment conversations to come next term

#### Landfill development works ~ \$10m


