Prior to Cyclone Gabrielle the Patoka Hall has been used for a variety of community uses from performances, social gatherings, education days, community well-being, training and workshops and everything in between. Since Cyclone Gabrielle the Patoka War Memorial Hall has been a lifeline for the community. The hall was used as our hub base with over 300 people across the community using the hall for information gathering/sharing, a safe sanctuary for support from financial to accessing health requirements and is where the community would come for their food, fuel and essential supplies. Because of the huge usage, particularly through the cyclone, the hall is in need of some basic maintenance and support. Two areas of most need is an external and internal paint job as well as some repairs and maintenance to be undergone in the bathrooms. The community has been through a lot over the past few months and with the loss of life of a huge contributor to the community, the plans moving forward is for the hall to continue to be able to be used free of charge for community gatherings, mental health and well-being workshops/sessions and a safe haven for the community as we traverse the winter.

Project Title	Electrical - replace and upgrade
Brief Project Description	The wiring in the hall has deteriorated, affecting the lights and the heating - two essential requirements for people's ability and desire to use the hall. The hall society began looking into this problem in October last year and an electrician assessed the issue. It was established that all the wiring needed to be replaced for the lights and heaters to work, and that what we had was no longer efficient or practical. We prioritised replacing the wiring and the lights, completed in March. We would now like to replace the heaters as colder months approach. Currently 8 of the 16 don't work - these heaters were installed possibly 50 years ago. The heaters are also inefficient in terms of power consumption and cost. We are seeking funding to help us finish the job of replacing these older, less efficient utilities.
Total Amount Requested	6,332.64
Project Rationale	Basic maintenance is essential for the longevity of the hall. Lighting is essential for any building to be able to be used. The heating is important for the school to use the hall in comfort, as well as provide a better atmosphere for any group using the hall. Many of our hires, our main source of income, are due to the fact the hall has heating. The Hall is also a civil defense designated zone. If we were to need to support displaced community members light and heating are essential.

Project Title	Poukawa Hall Ablutions Block, Weather Proofing and Ligting Upgrade
Brief Project Description	The Poukawa Hall has stood proud in our community for over 100 years and is the gathering point and hub of our local community. The recent cyclone has highlighted the need for communities to have a
	convenient and central point to meet and while our hall is exactly that for Poukawa, it is in desperate need of improvements to it's basic amenities.
	This project is to upgrade the ablutions block and make them amenable to users and aged persons and provide access for disabled people.
	The ablutions block at the back of the hall consists simply of two very primitive toilet stalls. There are no hand washing facilities in the stalls meaning the user must walk inside the hall to wash and dry their hands. Upgrading the ablutions block to include hand basins, soap dispensers and paper hand towel dispensers will be a great improvement on what is currently available.
	We would also like to do further work to weather proof the hall by replacing the front entrance doors and framing, repairing window surrounds, replacing the rear door and framing and replacing the weather boards at the gable end over the entrance way. The Poukawa hall withstood the force of cyclone Gabrielle despite the front doors being flung open by the powerful winds.
	I note we did receive some funding towards upgrading the entrance doors however that has not been enough to fully replace them and we were only able to achieve some repair work rather than a full weatherproof replacement.
	This project also includes an electrical component for the new ablutions block and improvements to the indoor and outdoor lighting of the hall.

Project Rationale	Updating the ablution block and lighting will make the hall more attractive to users and more accessible to our community who are diverse in age and physical ability.
	By improving the outdoor lighting and installing some security lighting, it will assist in making the it safer for users to move from the hall to their cars in the dark.

Brief Project Description	We require funding to repair two essential areas of Kereru Hall; Area one: Maintain weather tightness and protect external fabric from deterioration. The front door and adjacent window are not secure and are unlockable. Moisture leaks through the joinery and has lifted the flooring and created a damp area. We need to replace the window and door joinery (and locks).
	Area two: The kitchen windows above the food preparation surface and oven leak due to unstable joinery. This has resulted in the window sill/jam rotting, and in one area a hole has appeared. The windows require adequate sealing and the window jams replaced. The kitchen benches are the original ones and are worn down to the wood. These need to be replaced with stainless steel benchtops to improve the safety and hygiene of the food preparation areas.
Total Amount Requested	30,000.00
Project Rationale	The repairs requested will insure the integrity and structure of the hall securing future use by the Kereru community. A minimum requirement for continued use of Kereru Hall is to supply adequate facilities. Improving the building security, water proofing and repairing the kitchen will increase the usage of the hall by the community and protect its structure from further damage. Tots n Dots ECC uses the kitchen regularly and the hygiene status of the facilities is questionable. The recent Cyclone has emphasised the need for the Hall to be a safe, watertight and hygenic refuge for those who may become displaced or unable to access their homes. The Kereru Hall is an old building (established early 1900's) and as a consequence requires regular and ongoing maintenance. As outlined in our Strategic Plan (attached to this application) we have a number of important capital works projects to undertake in the next 5 years to ensure that the building is of a suitable standard.

Please outline the community usage of the hall	Kereru Hall is the cornerstone of our rural community and is a valued resource where people congregate for a variety of purposes including fundraising events, sport, community meetings and gatherings.
	The Hall is the home of Kereru Tots and Dots Early Childhood Centre (ECC) which has been operating two days a week since the early 1990's, currently Tuesdays

	and Wednesdays 9am - 3pm. Kereru School utilises the Hall for school productions, events and off-site education excursions. Kereru Hall is venue to a variety of community gatherings and has been well used during and post Cyclone Gabrielle. It is the emergency civil defence hub for Kereru and was used for HDC and Hawkes Bay Regional meetings post cyclone. Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) use the buildings for volunteer fire brigade practices and storing their equipment. Community groups use Kereru Hall as a venue for discussion groups (e.g. farm focus groups, environmental groups), Annual General Meetings and committee meetings. We have had three Small Hall Sessions performances drawing large crowds from the area and are hosting John Kirwin this month to speak to the community regarding mental health. We are expecting 100+ people to attend this presentation and community lunch. Annual fundraising events include the Kereru School dance and auction and quiz night. Community gatherings include Christmas carols, native planting working bee, pot luck dinners to welcome (and farewell) families to Kereru.
	Sport activities include weekly Squash practice and interclub competitions with teams visiting from Hastings and Havelock North. A local Squash ladder has been established and offers a great opportunity for farmers to get off the farm and connect with others. The Hall is used during the cricket season as the player/supporter base for the Kereru Cricket Club, with the games played on the field outside. Kereru Fitness Club are held weekly in the hall, led by two separate local residents and are accessible to anyone in the community. The community in Kereru are inclusive and motivated to provide every opportunity for their residents to connect which is imperative for mental wellbeing. The last several years have been difficult due to drought, COVID and more recently Cyclone Gabrielle. Kereru Hall is the safe meeting place and it is essential that we maintain this valuable
